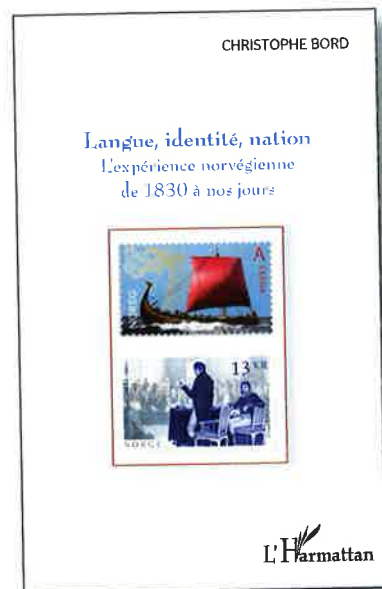
During the spring term I discuss Scandinavian emigration to the New World, and ask my students to read V. Moberg's emigrantepos.
